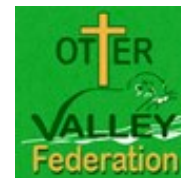

Minibeast Experience

The Reception class had a Minibeast Experience with Marie Pulman (from Animals 2U Southwest) yesterday. She had brought in different minibeasts for the children to learn about, see, touch and hold. The first animal was a Giant African Snail, which thoroughly enjoyed it's piece of cucumber! The second was a Giant Lime Green Stick Insect. Next the children saw the Mexican Red Knee Tarantula. Finally, they saw a Giant African Millipede. She also showed them the moult from the stick insect and the spider, and explained they shed this as they grow bigger.

A huge thank you to the Friends of Feniton, who kindly funded this for us. All the Reception children touched some of the minibeasts, and most also held the stick insect.
