Year 6CT Lottie for consistently displaying resilience and motivation in all areas and Rosie for an excellent hurdling technique in PE.

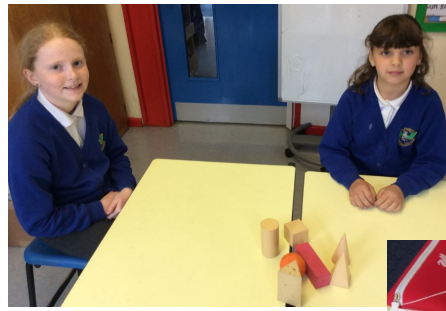

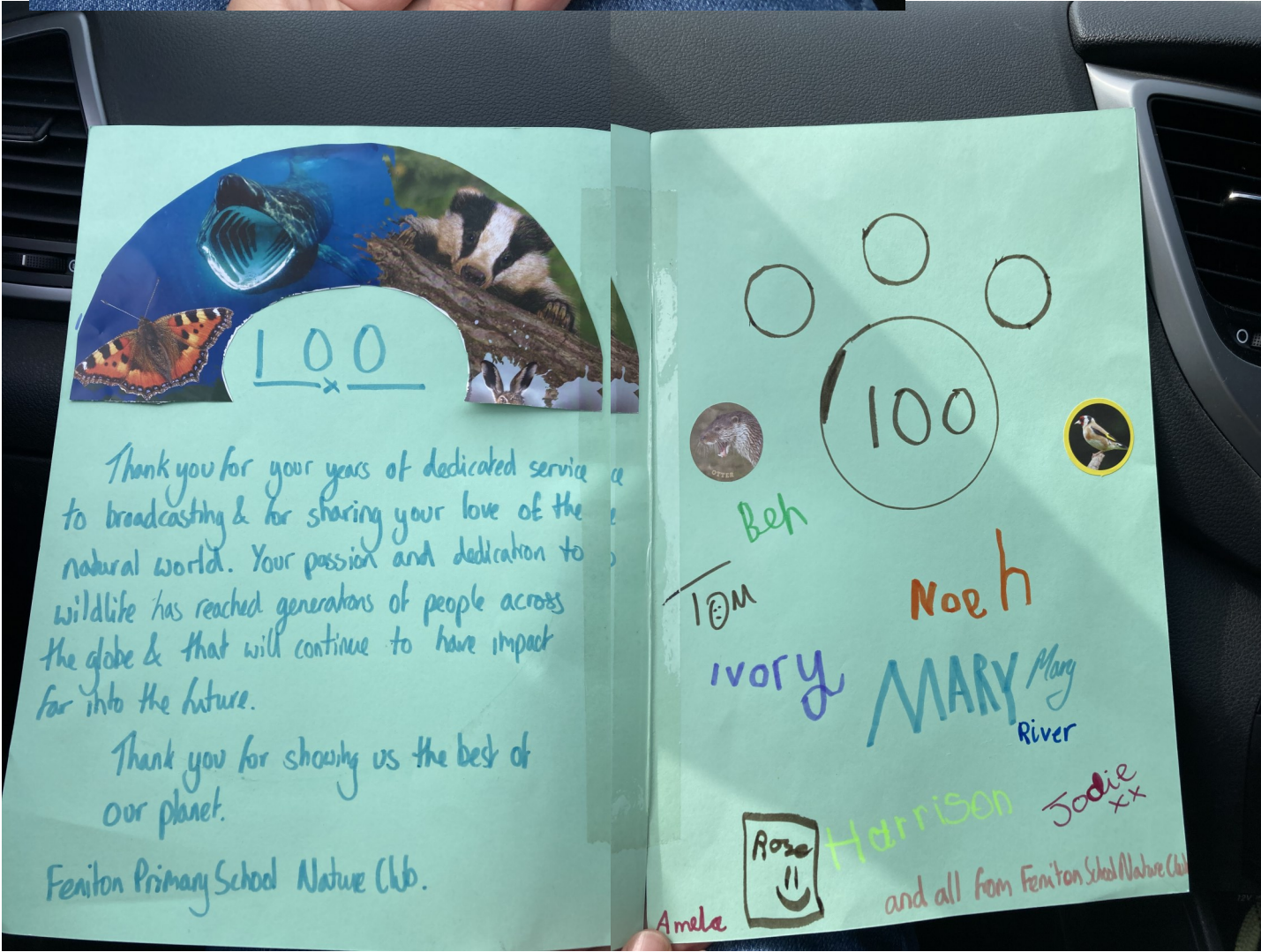
